

## Stem Program


• This familiar acronym with a twist stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math.



## THE MEDICAL FIELD



The longevity and affordability of medical schools may factor into international students' decision to avoid pursuing studies in the medical field. Opportunely, students who stay at the CEC dorms will receive information and support for entering into the medical field and other academic majors such as:

- 1) Physician Assistant (PA): Work under physician's supervision to diagnose, treat illnesses, and prescribe medications for patients. There are plenty of job opportunities within this field such as an Urgent Care Physician Assistant and an ICU Physician Assistant.
- 2) Nurse Practitioner: Nurse Practitioners are quickly becoming the health partner of choice for millions of Americans. As clinicians that blend clinical expertise in diagnosing and treating health conditions with an added emphasis on disease prevention and health management, NPs bring a comprehensive perspective and personal touch to health care.
- 3) Dentist: Help patients develop better oral hygiene. Students will be able to enroll in undergrad pre-dental programs to prepare for dental schools. The growing demand for dental services presumes more job opportunities for dental students.
- **4)Pharmacist:** Prepare, dispense, and control medications for customers and patients. Students will be exposed to early pharmaceutical studies which will prepare them for future job opportunity.
- 5) Chiropractor: Examine a patient's physical condition to treat spine and joint pains. All age groups are increasingly becoming interested in improving overall physical wellness, which is demanding more employment of chiropractors.
- 6) Clinical Laboratory Scientists (CLS): Provide data and aspects of medicine to determine the best treatment for patients. This field of study can be a great stepping stone as it can also open doors to other medical fields.
